REDUCING CLERK'S HOURS	GENERAL ORDER OF THE PRESIDING JUDGE

California faces unprecedented budgetary challenges resulting from the economic downturn and uncertainty caused by the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. To address a projected \$54.3 billion state budget gap and subsequent recession, Governor Gavin Newsom signed a Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-2021 state budget that included budget reductions throughout state government, including the judicial branch. As a direct result of these state funding challenges, the San Bernardino Superior Court projects a significant budget deficit that will impact how the court conducts its day-to-day business operations. Specifically, a significant reduction in staffing will delay the court's ability to provide services, and as a result, increase case processing backlogs.

After careful deliberation, the Presiding Judge has concluded that reducing the clerk's office hours is a necessary part of the court's reasonable and measured plan to manage extremely difficult financial challenges while minimizing the impact on the

citizens of San Bernardino County and providing equal access to the court. As alternatives to in-person clerk's office visits, there are various remote options for conducting court business, as summarized below:

- <u>Drop boxes</u> In accordance with California Rule of Court, rule 2.210, each courthouse will have drop boxes for filing papers Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 4 p.m. Any document deposited in a court's drop box by 4:00 p.m. on a court day is deemed to have been deposited for filing on that day. Any document deposited in a court's drop box (1) on a court day after 4:00 p.m. or (2) on a judicial holiday is deemed to have been deposited for filing on the next court day. No cash payments are accepted via drop box.
- <u>TurboCourt</u> In accordance with California Rule of Court, rule 2.253, court
 users may also access the court through TurboCourt which permits court users
 to prepare and submit documents to the court electronically.
- <u>Fax filing</u> In accordance with California Rules of Court, rule 2.300 et seq., court users may file documents by <u>facsimile</u>.
- Online options Court users may access case information and make fine or fee payments through the court's online Case Search and Calendar Search portal and payment system (Portal).

These options are not available for all case types. Specific information on remote options for various case types can be found on the court's website at www.sb-court.org.

Pursuant to California Rules of Court, rule 10.603, the court HEREBY ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

Beginning December 1, 2020 and continuing until further notice, all clerk's offices of the Superior Court of California, County of San Bernardino will reduce public service hours of operation on court days from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday,

to 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Dated: December 1, 2020 Michael A. Sachs
